DISCUSSION GUIDE

ICEBREAKER: Would you ever be interested in observing a surgery or do you turn away when the nurse brings out the needle? Why?

OVERVIEW: Is it possible to lose your salvation? In other words, is it possible to get saved, or born again, and then at some later point in time lose your salvation? In this discussion we will study the doctrine of eternal security, and discover that Scripture gives us good reasons to believe that we are secure in Christ.

- 2. Read John 6:35-40. What did Jesus mean by "whoever comes to Me will never again be hungry or thirsty?" Does this passage provide assurance that you cannot lose your salvation? Explain. According to this passage, who does our salvation depend upon?
