## **DISCUSSION GUIDE**

**ICEBREAKER**: What is the basis of your standard of right and wrong?

**OVERVIEW**: Sin is the greatest problem in the world, and in each of our lives. So what's the cure? The only way to find a cure is to first discover the cause. And that's what we find in Mark 7, where Jesus teaches the source of sin — the heart. In this discussion we will go deeper with how to apply this truth to our lives and relationships.

- 1. **Read Mark 7:14-23**. What insight, principle, or observation from this weekend's message did you find to be the most helpful, eye-opening, or troubling? Explain. (Or what was your key takeaway from Sunday's message?)
- 2. Apart from salvation in Jesus Christ, the human heart is hopelessly sinful. It is inclined to sin, and does not seek God, or do what is good. What light do the following verses shed on the nature of the unregenerate heart?
  - Genesis 6:5-7
  - Psalm 51:5
  - John 2:23-25
  - Ephesians 4:17-19
  - Titus 3:3
