DISCUSSION GUIDE

ICEBREAKER: What's unforgivable?

OVERVIEW: At Church Acadiana we place a heavy emphasis on the Bible. We preach it on Sundays, study it in Home Group, read it daily in our quiet times, teach it to our kids, and seek to share it with the world. And we're not alone.
