## **DISCUSSION GUIDE**

SAINTS IN CHRIST Colossians — Week 2

**ICEBREAKER**: What brings a tear to your eye?

**OVERVIEW**: When people think of a "saint," they usually think of someone who is uncommonly holy and spiritual — the best of the best among Christians. Yet the Bible calls all Christians saints. If you are a Christian, then you are a saint. If you are not a saint, then you are not a Christian. This week we are studying what it means to be a saint, and how we can grow in saintliness.

- 1. Read Colossians 1:1-2. What insight, principle, or observation from this weekend's message did you find to be the most helpful, eye-opening, or troubling? Explain. (Or what was your key takeaway from Sunday's message?)
- 2. Can you describe the process of sainthood in the Roman Catholic Church?
- 3. How do the saints in Colossae differ from Roman Catholic saints?
- 4. The word "saint" means "holy one," or one who is set apart for a special purpose. How are Christians set apart?
- 5. Read 1 Peter 1:15-16. What does it look like for a Christian to grow more saintly?

6. Read 2 Corinthians 7:1. Why should we be motivated to pursue holiness?

7. Read 2 Corinthians 6:16-18. What are the promises to us that motivate us to pursue holiness?

8. Read Romans 12:1. What does holiness have to do with worship?

9. What steps can a Christian take to grow in holiness (saintliness)?

10. Are you a saint? Explain.
