DISCUSSION GUIDE

ICEBREAKER: How do you handle anger?

OVERVIEW: Everyone is looking for a cause to serve. We all want to contribute to something greater than ourselves; to make the world a better place. God created us to live for so much more than pleasure, vanity, self-preservation, and the survival of our species. We were created to serve almighty God by living for His purpose on the earth. c. What do you think Jesus was saying about the kingdom of God (v. 3)?
