DISCUSSION GUIDE

ICEBREAKER: Do you remember jokes very well? What's the best joke you've heard recently?

OVERVIEW: It's no secret. The economy is not good. Many are calling this economic downturn "Bidenflation," blaming President Biden. Inflation is at a 40-year high. The stock-market is way down. Is there anything we can do to survive this economy? Yes! God has promised to provide for His people, and His promises never fail. However, there are some conditions that we must fulfill. We must do our part. That's what this study is all about. In this discussion we will go deeper with the conditions we must meet to inherit God's promise of provision.

 - e. What is the condition in this passage?
- 6. Sunday's sermon was about four actions we can take to secure God's blessing on our finances. The first was to prioritize your relationship with God (see Mt 6:33). What does it mean to prioritize your relationship with God? Do you need to make any changes in your life to make God your top priority? Explain.
- 7. The second action is to repent of all known sin (see Proverbs 3:33). How does sin hurt us financially?
- 8. The third action to inherit God's promise of provision is to tithe (see Malachi 3:10-12). Is tithing easy or difficult for you? Explain.
- 9. The final action is generosity (see Proverbs 28:27). How can you grow in generosity?
