DISCUSSION GUIDE

ICEBREAKER: If you were a WWE SmackDown champion wrestler, what would be your name and calling card?

OVERVIEW: Many Christians tithe, but that's all they give. Yet generosity only begins after you have tithed. Tithing is the starting line of generosity, not the finish line. Tithing is the training wheels of generosity. It helps us to start giving, but God wants us to grow and eventually take the training wheels off. To climb the generosity ladder and excel at giving, we must learn to give beyond the tithe as God leads. In this discussion we will learn how to move beyond tithing to generosity.

 - e. What can we learn from this story about giving a small amount of money?
- 6. Is hardship an excuse for not giving? Explain.
- 7. Why should we aspire to give beyond the tithe?
- 8. When you give beyond the tithe, do you have to give it to the church?
- 9. What do you need to do to grow in generosity?
