DISCUSSION GUIDE

How to Know God's Will Romans 12:2 Stand-alone Sermon

ICEBREAKER: Which of the five senses do you treasure most? Why?

- 7. Read Romans 12:2. What are the four steps to knowing God's will?
- 8. What does it mean to "not be conformed to this age"?
