DISCUSSION GUIDE

ICEBREAKER: How important is it to you that people remember, spell, and pronounce your name correctly? Why?

OVERVIEW: All human beings are unique, with different tastes, preferences, strengths, weaknesses, and personalities. But there are some things we all have in common. Two of our most important commonalities are death and the final judgment. Everyone agrees with the certainty of death, but the notion of a final judgment is more controversial. But for Bible-believing Christians, there's no getting around it. "Just as people are destined to die once, and after that to face judgment (Heb 9:27, NIV)." In this discussion will go deeper with the subject of the final judgment.
