DISCUSSION GUIDE

ICEBREAKER: Whom do you run to when something bad happens in your life?

OVERVIEW: There is a difference between Christianity and all other religions. All other religions teach that good people go to heaven, while Christianity teaches that forgiven people go to heaven. The belief that good people go to heaven can be called performance-based religion, and it is unbiblical and harmful. In this discussion we will go deeper with the problems with performance-based religion.
