DISCUSSION GUIDE

ICEBREAKER: What's one guilty pleasure you enjoy too much to give up?

OVERVIEW: In Galatians 5:1-15, the apostle Paul continues to warn against performance-based religion, while also adding a new warning. He focuses on two mistakes every Christian must avoid: Legalism, and libertinism. In this discussion we will go deeper with the dangers of these mistakes, and talk about how to avoid them.

- 1. What insight, principle, or observation from this weekend's message did you find to be the most helpful, eye-opening, or troubling? Explain. (Or what was your key takeaway from Sunday's message?)
- 2. Imagine you could write a letter to a group of new believers, warning them about the common mistakes Christians make? What is one mistake you would warn them about?
- 3. What is a big mistake that you have made in your journey as a Christian?
- 4. Which mistake is more destructive legalism or libertinism? Explain.
- 5. Read 1 John 2:3-6.
 - a. What is the evidence that a person has been saved?
 - b. What does it mean "in him the love of God is made complete" (v. 5)?
