DISCUSSION GUIDE

WHY SOME CHRISTIANS AREN'T FRUITFUL Mark 4:1-20 Parable—Week 1

ICEBREAKER: What's your favorite thing about the Christmas season?

OVERVIEW: God wants you to be a fruitful Christian. But what does it mean to be fruitful, and what must you do to become a fruitful Christian? In this study we will go deeper with why many Christians aren't fruitful, and what you must do to produce more fruit.

- 2. What is a parable?
- 3. What does it mean to be a fruitful Christian?
- 4. Why is it important to be a fruitful Christian?
- 5. Read John 15:1-8 and answer the following questions.
 - a. According to verses 1-2, what does the Father do to help you produce more fruit?
 - b. According to verse five, what must you do to be fruitful?
 - c. What does it mean to "remain" or "abide" in Christ?
 - d. What glorifies God (see verse 8)? Why?

- 6. Read Mark 4:3-8 and refer to Sunday's sermon for the following questions. The parable is about three soils that aren't fruitful. Why isn't the first soil fruitful? How does this apply to being a fruitful Christian? (See Mark 4:4, 15.)
- 7. Why isn't the second soil fruitful? How does this apply to being a fruitful Christian? (See Mark 4:5, 16-17.)
- 8. Why isn't the third soil fruitful? How does this apply to being a fruitful Christian? (See Mark 4:7, 18-19.)
- 9. What's the most urgent thing you need to do to become more fruitful?
