## **DISCUSSION GUIDE**

**ICEBREAKER**: When have you felt betrayed?

**OVERVIEW**: Studies show that Christians are struggling to embrace the call to serve. A Gallup poll discovered that only 10% of church members are active in any kind of personal ministry in their church, and 50% said they have no desire or interest in serving in any ministry. This is alarming. Jesus exemplified the life of a servant, and He commands us to follow in His steps. In this discussion we will go deeper with how to be humble servants.

- 1. What insight, principle, or observation from this weekend's message did you find to be the most helpful, eye-opening, or troubling? Explain. (Or what was your key takeaway from Sunday's message?)
- 2. Has someone recently served you in a meaningful way? Explain.
- 3. How does it make you feel when you serve others?
- 4. Why do people struggle to embrace an attitude of servanthood?
- 5. Read Matthew 20:25-28 and answer the following questions.
  - a) What is the wrong way to lead?
  - b) How can a leader be a servant at the same time?
  - c) What is the key to greatness? How does this contrast with the world's definition of and path to greatness?
  - d) How did Jesus set the example of servanthood?

- 9. When and where should you assume the form of a servant (see Philippians 2:7)?
- 10. What are some ways that you can better serve your family, your church family, your Home Group, your coworkers, and your friends?
