The Apostles' Creed
Week 4

ICEBREAKER: What's your perfect dream vacation spot?

OVERVIEW: There are several branches of theology, but Christology is the most important because it determines your eternal destiny. What you believe about Jesus determines whether you go to heaven or hell. This is why the Apostles' Creed devotes more space to Christ than anything else. One theologian suggests that we should see the Creed as a confession of Christ with an introduction and a conclusion. In this study we will go deeper with the words in the Creed, "I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary."

1. Recite the Apostles' Creed Together: I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth; I He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.
